

In May 1983 I won a contested election to The Court of Common Council for The Ward of Cheap and have represented the Ward on various Committees including presently the Port and City of London Health and Social Services, the Central Markets and the Music Committees.

I am a member of the City Livery Club and of the Cheap and Cordwainer Ward Clubs.

My wife Patricia who has her own family connections with the City through her late father, General Sir Rodney Moore, supports me wholeheartedly and it is with that support that I pledge myself, if elected, to discharge to the very best of my abilities the responsibilities of the ancient and honourable office of Sheriff of The City of London.
