I am a member of the City Livery Club and the United Wards Club and am on the Committees of the Tower Ward Club, Castle Baynard Ward Club and the City of London Historical Society.

I am a Trustee of the Geffrye Museum, Honorary Treasurer of the Metropolitan Public Gardens Association, a member of the London Topographical Society and the Georgian Group. In 1987 I was the lay adviser for the Civic Trust awards for Buckinghamshire.

My wife Jennifer works part-time as a Consultant Demographer, mainly in town planning. She has been a JP since 1978 and is a Vice-Chairman of the Chiltern Bench, and Vice-Chairman of the Governors of Dr Challoner's High School for Girls. She is Chairman of the Chesham Society and is an elected member of the National Council of Civic Trust Societies. She would welcome the opportunity to play her part in the civic team next year.
