To the Liverymen of the City of London

My Lords, Ladies and Gentlemen,

Encouraged by many friends in the Livery and supported by The Master and Court of The Guild of Air Pilots and Air Navigators, I offer myself as a candidate for the High Office of Sheriff at the election to be held in Common Hall at Guildhall on MONDAY 25th JUNE 2001 at TWELVE NOON.

I request that you use one of your two votes in support of me and the other in support of Alderman Michael Savory.

Born in Salisbury, Wiltshire in 1945, I was educated at Sherborne, Grenoble University and the College of Air Training, Hamble. On graduating from Hamble in 1965, I joined British European Airways as a pilot flying Tridents, transferring to BOAC in 1966 flying Boeing 707s. I trained as flight navigator and later flight navigation instructor. I was promoted to command in 1976 on the Super VC10 and later appointed Training Captain. After commanding the last commercial flight of the VC10 in 1981 I converted to the Boeing 747, finally retiring as a Senior Check Captain in January 2000.

In 1998 I was awarded The Master Air Pilot's Certificate. I am a Fellow of the Royal Aeronautical Society, a Member of the Royal Institute of Navigation, The Air League and The Air Squadron.

Having become a Freeman of the Guild of Air Pilots and Air Navigators in 1972 I was admitted to the Livery in 1975, serving on several of the Guild's charitable committees and trusts. I was elected to the Court of Assistants in 1981, to the office of Warden in 1987 and then served as Master in 1991/92. I am a former member of the Livery Committee of the City of London; Chairman of the 1991/92 Livery Masters' Association; a member of the City Livery Club and The Royal Society of St George (City of London Branch) and a Freeman Citizen of Glasgow and a member of the Incorporation of Gardeners of Glasgow.

Outside the Livery I am a Knight of the Hospitaller Order of St. Lazarus of Jerusalem and support many charities mainly in the care of the young, old and sick and am on the electoral roll of the Parish of St. Michael's, Cornhill, the Guild's Church.

I love sailing and have been involved in ocean racing and more recently in cruising. I am a member of The Royal Motor Yacht Club and Parkstone Yacht Club. I enjoy skiing and I was a judge with the Ski Club of Great Britain.

My wife Ann is a Freeman of the City of London and takes an active interest in City affairs. She is an accomplished artist and a keen and productive gardener. I am pleased to have the wholehearted support of my wife and our daughter Elsbeth.

As a Past Master of one of the modern Livery Companies, which is very much a working Company, with active overseas regional committees and with a career spent travelling all over the world, I would like to contribute enthusiastically to our global City. If elected to the office of Sheriff, I will support The Lord Mayor loyally in his worldwide role. I would like particularly to enhance the cause of aviation in the City.
